General Policies for all Grade Levels

Expectations of all enrolled in the religious ed program:

- 1. Attend class and participate to the best of their ability.
- 2. Show respectful behavior to the catechists and fellow classmates.
- 3. More than **6** absences may require a grade to be repeated.
- 4. Complete any missed assignments.
- 5. Early release: a child must be signed out for their safety.
- 6. Attend and participate at all liturgical events and class functions.
- 7. Call the Religious Education office to report an absence or tardy.
- 8. We are a **NUT FREE** facility due to the danger of allergies.
- 9. ALL ELECTRONICS must be put in backpacks or will be taken away until the class-time is ended
- 10. Family Masses & special events: Regular class time 4:30pm

Parents/Guardians are expected to:

- 1. Keep the Sabbath holy by attending weekend Mass with your child.
- 2. Review each week's lesson with your child.
- 3. Occasionally attend and/or help at special events.
- 4. Assure your child knows the following prayers (by their grade)

Prayers- all children should know the following prayers by:

Kindergarten: Sign of the Cross, Grace Before Meals

First Grade: Glory Be, Hail Mary, Our Father Second Grade: Act of Contrition, Guardian Angel

Third Grade: Apostle's Creed Fourth Grade: Nicene Creed

Fifth Grade: How to pray the Rosary with Mysteries

Sixth Grade: All the Mass Prayers

Conf. Level 1 & 2: Prayer to the Holy Spirit & all the above (Repetition works! Using these prayers during family prayer time will help)

Drop off/Pick up procedures:

Drop-off: Earliest arrival time for class-time is 4:15pm

All children gather in the gym for songs before going to classrooms

(L1 & L2 go straight to their classrooms)

Pick-up: students dismissed from the gym door

K-2 must have a parent/guardian pick them up at the gym door

Communication

"REMIND" a free app is used for important communication (download is required). Notate on your Registration Form the cell number & email. This communication is essential for emergency closings, meeting reminders, etc.

"Empowering God's Children"

This is a safe environment program, taught in each grade emphasizing every child should feel safe. The curriculum is available to view. You must notify the office by September 30, if you want to opt your child out.

Vincent Pallotti Parish. All accounts MUST be <u>paid in full by January</u> 31st. Financial hardship? Contact us to discuss other arrangements.

Seeking a Sacrament for your child? You must:

- 1. Provide a copy of the child's baptismal certificate.
- 2. Attend <u>ALL</u> scheduled parent meetings and retreats.
- 3. Assure good weekly class attendance of your child.
- 4. Help with prayers and other spiritual guidance.
- 5. Attend Sunday Mass each week.

An original Baptism Certificate must be presented unless we can verify the baptism at either St. Vincent Pallotti or Our Lady of the Scapular.

Sacrament Preparation - 2-Year Program for Eucharist & Confirmation

Parents MUST attend a mandatory Sacrament Readiness meeting if you plan for your child to receive the sacraments of Eucharist or Confirmation (see bulletin or website for dates).

<u>First Eucharist</u> – Level 1 & Level 2 program (begins 1st & 2nd grade) <u>Confirmation</u> – Level 1 & Level 2 program (begins 7th & 8th grade)

Note: sacrament preparations require additional sessions, retreats, etc.

<u>Family OCIA (Order for Christian Initiation of Adults)</u> - A program to specifically help prepare children who have not regularly attended religious formation classes and would like to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and/or Confirmation. Call the religious education office for more information.

Family Catechesis Program:

Registering for this program you agree to the following:

- Parent takes the primary role as the child's catechist
- Chapters are completed at home following the syllabus
- Attend a monthly meeting (parents & children) according to schedule each month starting with 4pm Mass followed by meeting in St Joseph Hall 4pm-6pm.

Policies for Health & Safety

- water bottles are allowed (water only! to help with sanitation)
- We are a NUT FREE facility
